

**ART DISPLAY ON STREET
OVER THREE MILES LONG**

PROVINCETOWN, Mass, July 31.

—An art exhibition on a busy street three and one-half miles long is probably unique in the art annals anywhere. Provincetown, celebrating its two-hundredth anniversary as a self-governing community, from Aug. 4 to 7, has invited the artists who summer here to use the tradesmens' windows to display their latest paintings.

Commercial Street winds its slender way along the shore for the entire length of the town, and every desirable window will be taken. Charles Hawthorne and Richard Miller, both national academicians, W. Auerbach Levy, Gerrit A. Beneker, Ross Moffit, Charles Kaesela and others are exhibiting.
