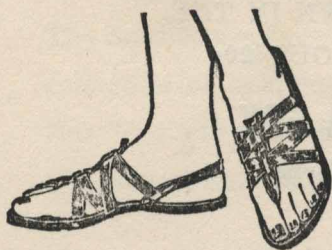

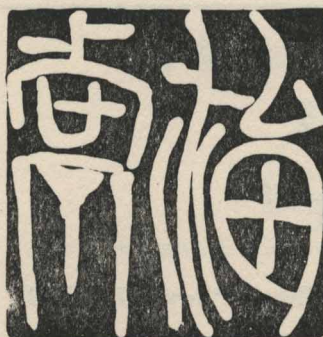

To these ends it shall operate strictly within its charter as a non-profit, educational, artistic, and cultural organization.

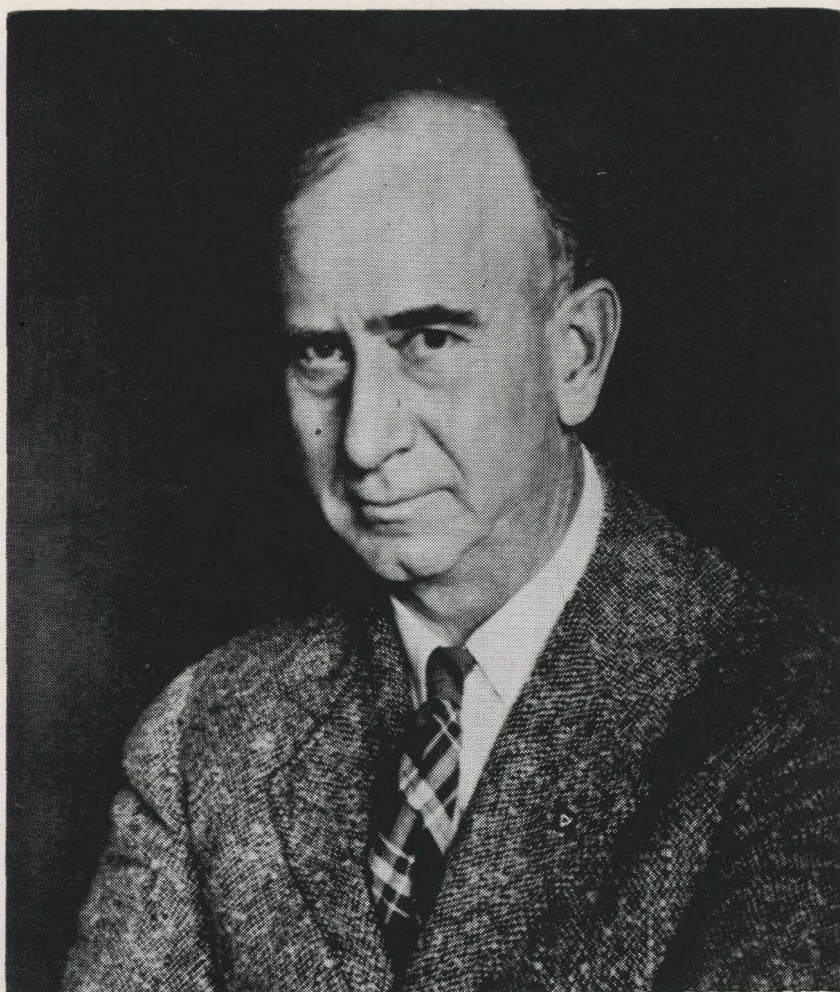

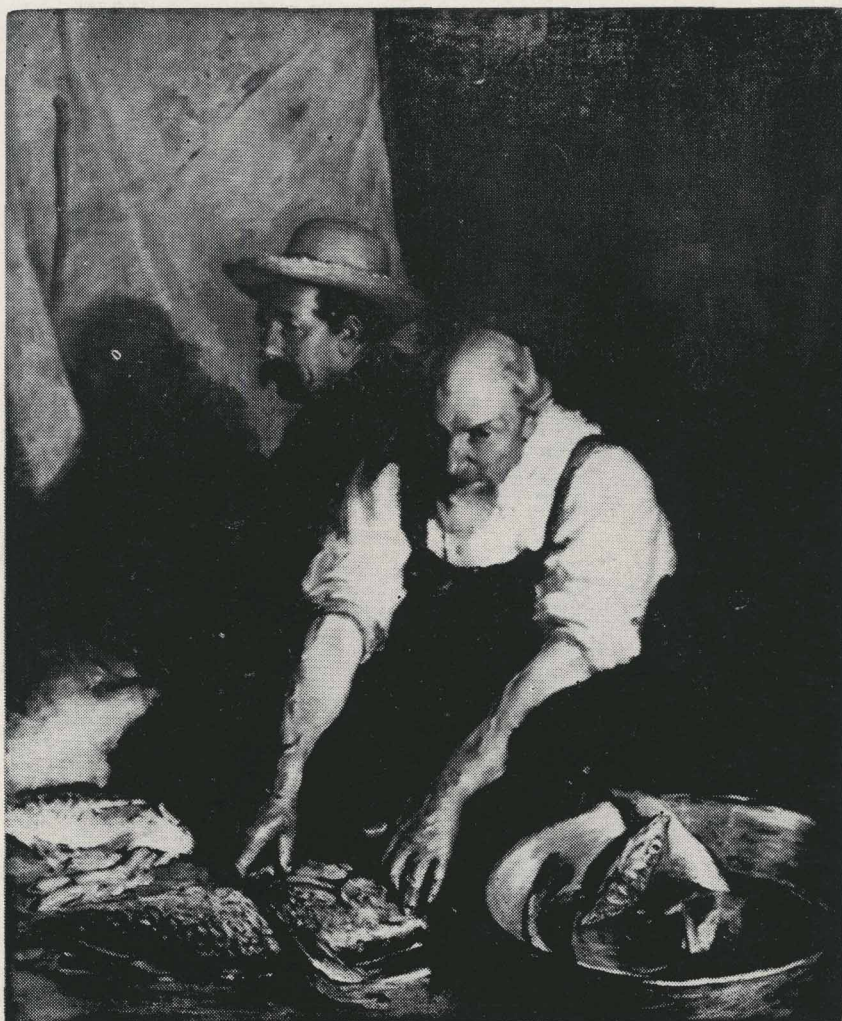


CHARLES W. HAWTHORNE

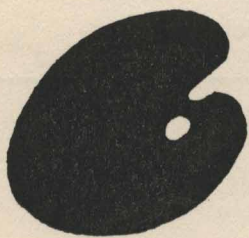
