Name For A Street

"Mr. Editor: In your last issue, there was a short article asking for a name for the street running from Dill's Bakery To Commercial Street. 16 ft. of this street was formerly a part of the old homestead of Deacon David Ryder and was owned by the family 100 years. Please call it "Ryder Street" Much obliged, &c,

Province town, April 24, 1872."

We can see no objection to calling this thoroughfare Ryder Street. On the other hand, it seems most appropriate, the Ryder family having held for so long a time the estates upon it. We believe everybody on the street will consent to having the street sign erected in honor of the family immediately.
