The first landing place of the Pilgrims on the shores of America was at Provincetown. Therefore on August 29th there will begin here the year of celebrations throughout the United States that will observe the great event in our history, the founding of the Nation here by the signing of the immortal Compact in this harbor.

The Compact is to the history of modern free government what the Magna Charta was to the centuries between. Therefore we can say that the center of all American Institutions lies in Provincetown.

Suitable memorials are to be erected connecting the Pilgrim Monument with the harbor where the Compact was signed.

In the developing of the Celebration valued assistance is being rendered to Provincetown by the United States Government, The Sulgrave Institution, The Mayflower Council, and the Patriotic Societies of the United States.
