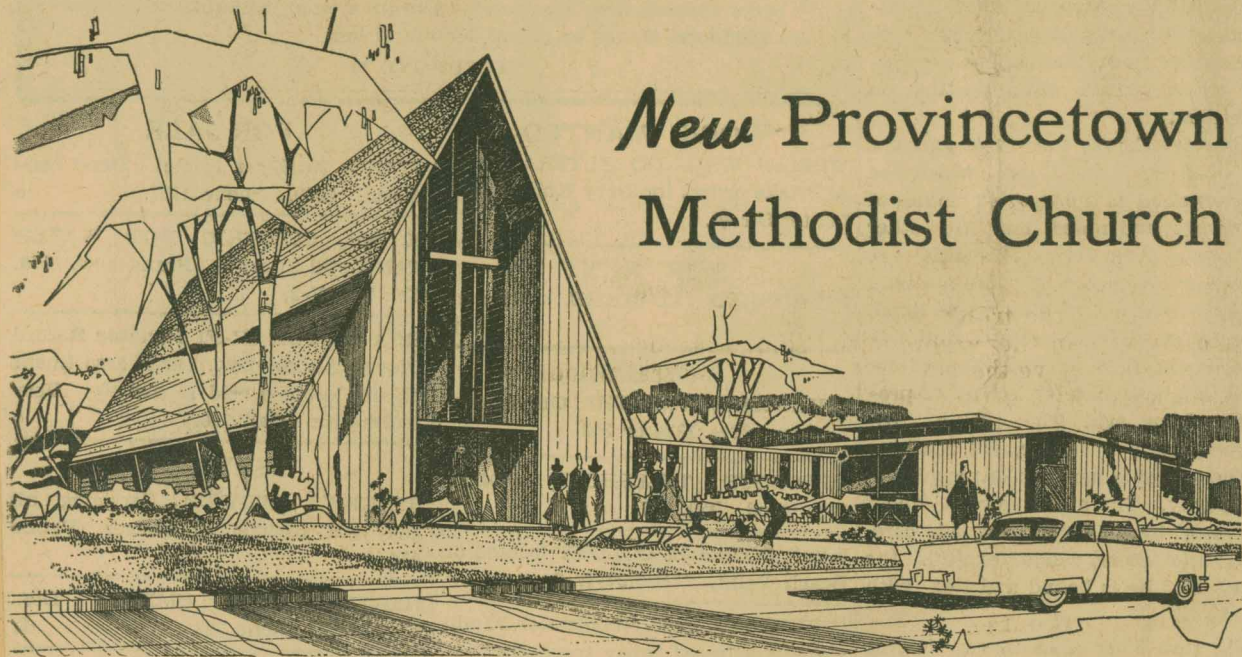


WE FACE THE FUTURE-- A New Church Is Born

THE CHURCH IN ACTION

The Church meets each Sunday for formal and informal worship. Children attend Church School in 6 departments. Two youth groups meet each Sunday.

A Woman's Society of Christian Service, Married Couples Club function monthly. A weekly bowling program provides fellowship and relaxation.

It co-sponsors a Boy Scout troop.

With new facilities new activities and programs can be added.

Above is the architect's composite sketch of the exterior of the new Provincetown Methodist Church, which was approved at the First Quarterly Conference earlier this month. Working drawings are now being made. The church is architecturally designed to lend itself to the site on Shank Painter Road. The building will consist of the nave, an educational unit which will provide modern facilities for religious education, church offices, and a parish hall with modern kitchen. The building will be clustered around a courtyard which will serve as an outdoor chapel in the Summer, and ample off-street parking will allow parishioners to take advantage of the new building facilities. Church architect is Donaldson Ray MacMullin and Associates of Cambridge.
