Love boat' to start cruises on June 7

The newly refurbished Cape Cod Princess, a 94-foot steel vessel, will start daily cruises and whale watches from Provincetown and Plymouth on June 7.

This summer will be the first season for the Cape Cod Princess, which will dock at Bobby Cabral's Fishermen's Wharf in Provincetown and at State Pier in Plymouth next to the Mayflower II.

The boat will offer whale watch expeditions from both Provincetown and Plymouth on weekends only during May. Throughout the summer, in addition to passenger crossings from Plymouth to Provincetown, evening music cruises around Cape Cod Bay will be available from both towns.

The music cruises will feature live bands playing classical music concerts, pops concerts, popular jazz, country and western, disco and broadway show tunes.

Each Tuesday the Cape Cod Princess will go on a lobster festival cruise through Cape Cod Canal. There will be dancing to Broadway show music during the five-hour cruise.

Each Saturday the boat will take love cruises around Cape Cod Bay with dancing and entertainment.

The Plymouth and Provincetown Steamship Companies, owners of the Cape Cod Princess, will make the boat available for fund-raising events for charities. Group rates and senior citizen and student discounts are available.

The vessel carries 379 passengers. The steamship company also owns the Yankee Clipper and the American Eagle, cruise ships for historical tours around Plymouth Harbor. The company's Columbia, a converted fishing trawler, is now docked at State Pier in Plymouth and used for gift shops.
