
Work Starts Soon On Traffic Circle

John F. Nooms, North Truro contractor, successful bidder for the construction of a traffic turn around circle in Province lown's West End, near the breakwater, says that he has received the approval of the State Department of Public Works and instructions to start work as soon as the survey has been completed. He plans to commence construction next Monday.

First step will be to fill and harden an area near the end of the breakwalter for a 40-ton crame which is to be used in moving the heavy stones at the end of the breakwalten. The red brick monument marking the First Landing Place of the Pilgrims will be moved to the center of the circle and three walks will lead to it from the circle. Earle Nickerson of Chatham has the contract for moving the monument.

Mn. Noones, who is doing the Jerome-Winthrop Street improvement under Chapter 90, said this job should be ready for the road base by Wednesday.
