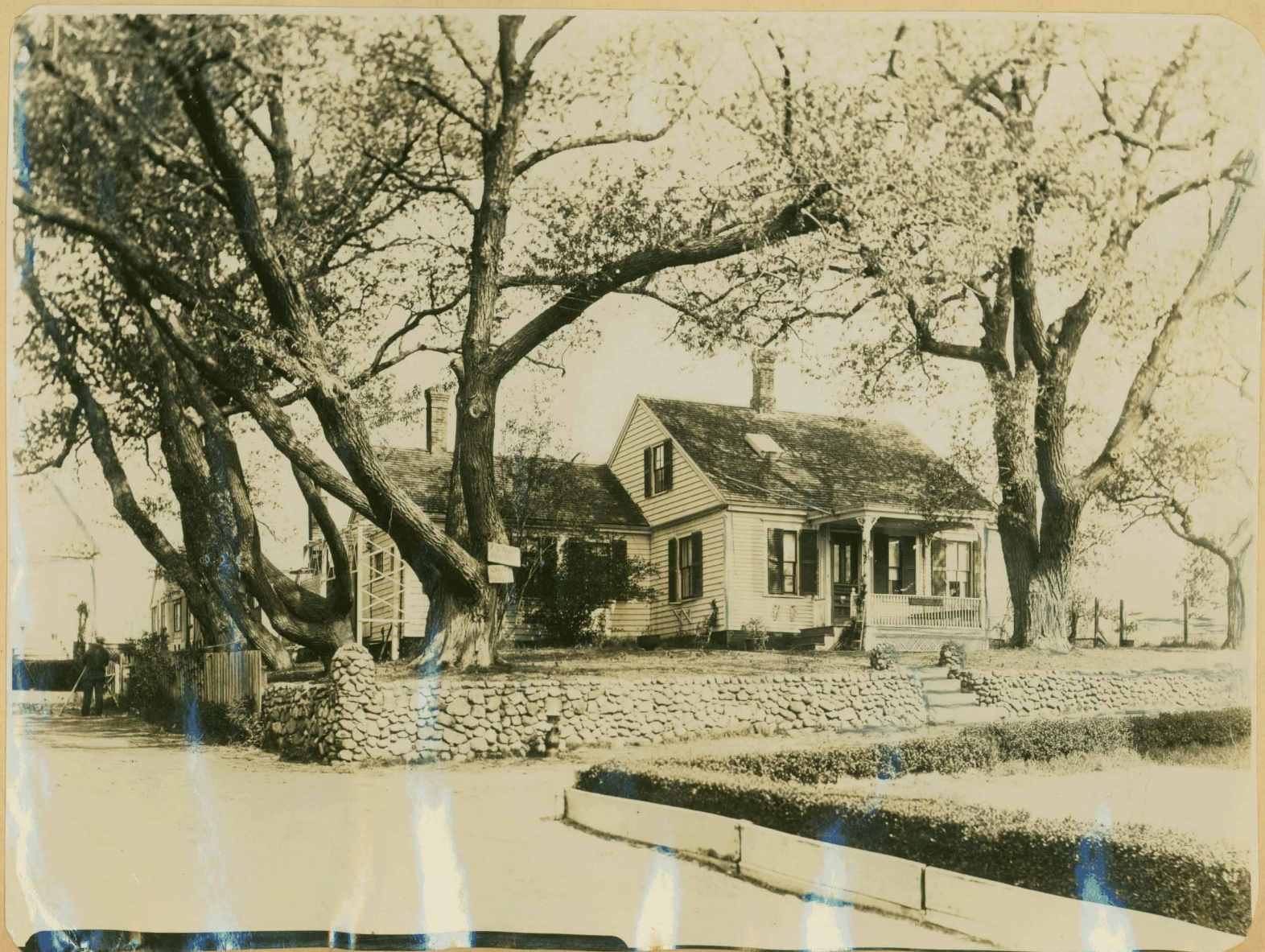


Last house on right at end of Tremont Street.
