

Race Point Life Saving Station, Provincetown, Mass.

In 1909 Capt. Sam O. Fisher and his crew of five men and one horse manned the Race Point Life Saving Station built in 1873. The 24-foot double ended surf boat on the cart was one of three boats kept here; one was always in readiness for launching. It was Capt. Sam, late in 1898, who heard four blasts of a steamer's whistle, the last signal ever to come from the steamer Portland, and fourteen hours later seaman Johnson picked up a life preserver marked "Portland." During the fifteen years before this picture was taken, 92 vessels carrying over 500 persons met disaster near this station.
