As per Tom Boland (1994): The house is shown on the map of 1836 and the atlas of 1858. In 1880, it was owned by R. Collis. A directory for 1886 lists a Manuel Mede, a fisherman and a Walter O'Connors as residing there, but no reference is made to Mr. O'Connor's occupation. By 1907, 3 Court Street had come under the ownership of W. Welch.
