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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

Describe architectural features. Evaluate the characteristics of this building in terms of other buildings in the community.

This building is a 1-story, 4-bay 3/4 cottage with a 2-part rear ell. The side gable roof has a central brick chimney at the ridge. The main entry consists of a pane and panel door with storm; a gable hood above is supported by pendants end brackets, reflective of the Italianate style. Windows include 1/1 replacement DHS with wood trim; 2/2 DHS in 1-story rear ell section. The rear ell has a 2-story section continuing the main block and a 1-story section that extends slightly north of the 2-story section. Secondary entrances are located here on east facade and north facade. The 1-story section has a gable roof.
