81 Bradford Street is a 5-bay, Colonial Revival-style cottage; the side gable roof has partial returns and is clad in asphalt shingles, there is a brick chimney located at the roof ridge; the exterior is clad in wood shingles and the foundation is poured concrete; the fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS with storms installed; the primary entrance is flanked by pilasters and has a fanlight accessed by wood steps lead to the central entry; a secondary entrance contains an enclosed side-gable vestibule on the side façade with partial returns; There is a 2-car modern garage attached to the raised basement; there is access into the house at this location.
