2-story, 4-bay, faces south; asphalt roof shingles; brick exterior chimney on east; fenestration includes 2/2 vinyl DHS with operable shutters, smaller 2/2 on 2nd floor, 2/2 wood DHS on historic porch; primary entrance unclear - total of five entrances; southeast corner, facing south contains a vertical plank door with strap hinges accessed by brick and concrete steps; east façade contains exterior steps to 2nd floor entrance; 4-bay, hipped-roof historic porch on west side with pane and panel wood door; 1-story cross gable addition to north side with 4-pane vinyl casements;
