216-218 Bradford Street is a 2-story, 6-bay, Astylistic, double house; the roof is side gable with 2 skylights on the front slope, a brick chimney rises from the roof ridge and the gable ends have partial returns; the exterior is clad in clapboard siding and the foundation is concrete block and brick; the fenestration includes 6/6 wood DHS with storms; the primary entrance contains centered paired entries with a surround including pilasters and entablature; the rear ell has exterior steps accessing the 2nd story.
