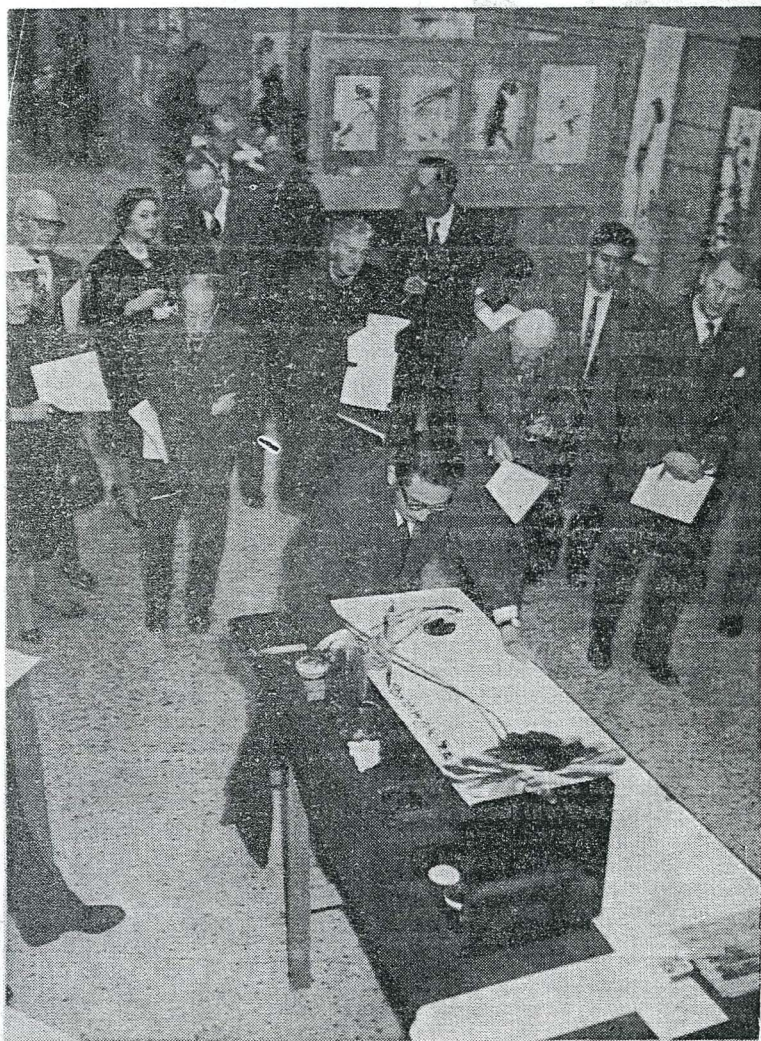


## Master Of The Brush

David Kwok, expressionistic Chinese artist from Hong Kong, will be the featured artist at the North Aruro Art Gallery beginning Sunday, August 9. A highlight of the week's showing will be a lecture-demonstration by Mr. Kwok on Tuesday evening, August 11 at 8 p. m. Admission to the lecture-demonstration will be by reservation only. Reservations may be made by contacting the North Truro Art Gallery.

Mr. Kwok's painting represents a new discipline of the classical style. He has inherited the traditional method, but enriches it with his new techniques and ideas. His simple and vigorous strokes, prolific and elegant, stand out in the so-called Hsieh-i or expressionistic style of Chinese painting. Mr. Kwok began his training in traditional brush work under the great painter Ch'i Pai-shih. His creative ability was combined with Ch'i's refined techniques to consolidate the foundations of his art.

After graduating from the Art Institute of Nanking, the United States Government awarded Mr. Kwok a scholarship for the study of Occidental art in America. He studied first at

Iowa State University and later at Columbia University and the Art Students League.

Mr. Kwok has had more than 25 one-man exhibitions. In the United States he has exhibited in Chicago, San Francisco, New York, Washington, D. C., and Boston. He has also had one-man shows in Hong Kong, England, Germany, Singapore, Thailand and Malaya. His work is in the permanent collections of Art Institute of Chicago, Imperial Institute of London, Michigan State College, Boston Museum of Fine Arts, Colorado Women's College, Koln Museum of Oriental Art, and the Arts Council of Malaya.

Mr. Kwok has been a lecturer under the arts program in more than seventy-five American colleges. He is at present Associate Professor of Art, Upsala College.
