Dedication

Charlie Malaquias passed away last Easter from cancer, and would have been 85 years old this summer.

Malaquias represented quite a number of Portuguese fishermen - immigrants who make Provincetown a remarkable stew of people. Like many, he came from a large family, was a great dancer in his youth, and was a snappy dresser. He was also a fisherman through and through.

Many describe Charlie Malaquias as the salt-of-the-earth kind of person. Whether he caught fish or hadn't caught fish, he was jolly regardless. He was thoughtful, the kind of young fellow who would think to send a pretty dress home to his young sister while he was down fishing off Virginia.

After running Charlie's Fish Market in Provincetown for a number of years when his days on deck had come to an end, Malaquias moved to Plymouth. There he became sort of a Professor Emeritus of Fishing to Plymouth watermen, and was always available to put on a new bag or fix a head rope.

Charlie Malaquias was working on a net in his back yard the day before he died. He was the kind of man the Blessing of the Fleet is dedicated to.
