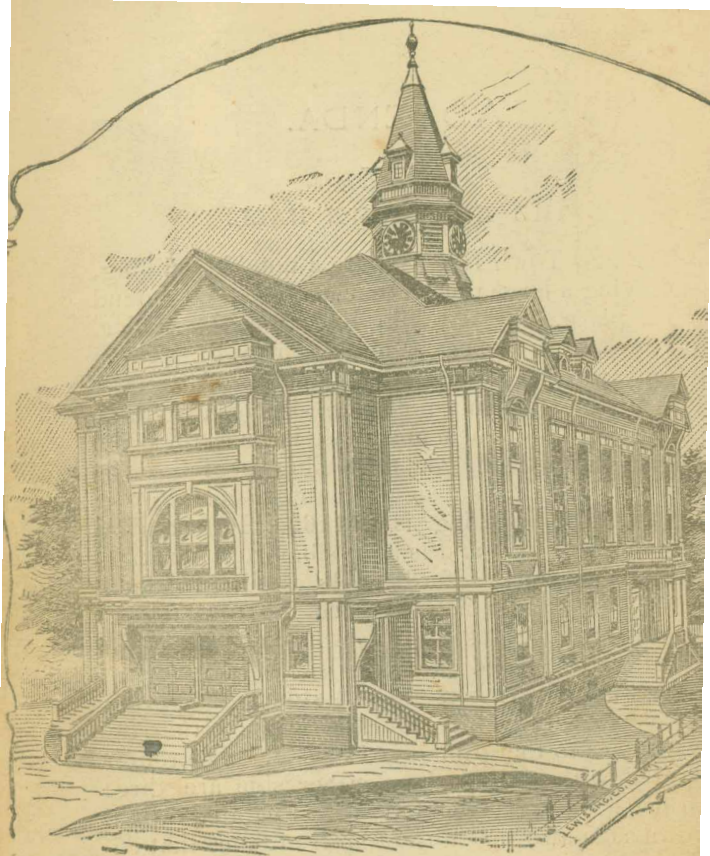


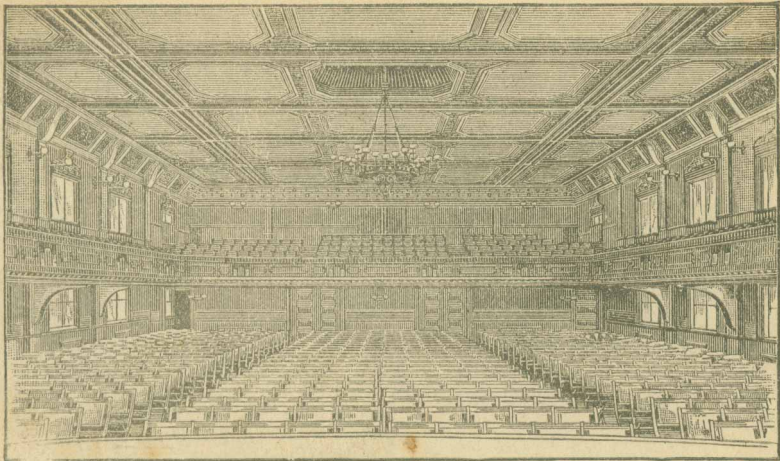
ADDENDA.

THE NEW TOWN HALL.

The new Town Hall is quite a notable building, occupying a large plot of the most valuable ground in the place, (presented by Rev. Wm. H. Ryder, of Chicago,) and cost about \$50,000. There is not, probably, a town hall of equal importance in the State in a place the size of Provincetown, and although some think it finer than the town can afford, the general feeling is of decided satisfaction in it, as a sign of enterprise and prosperity. The building is 114x62. It fronts on Commercial street and is accessible from Commercial, Ryder and Bradford streets. It is surmounted by a tower in which is placed the town clock, the gift of Hon. Joseph P. Johnson, one of our oldest and esteemed citizens, also the bell presented by John F. Nickerson of Boston. The tower is covered with copper, and the distance from the final tower to the ground is 120 feet. The roof is covered with slate and on either side are three dormer windows. The building is painted a light brown as is also the substantial iron fence that encloses the grounds.
