

Ashley Lyle Bradley (Kip) Mr. Bradley is a summer resident of P' town. He is a regular performer at both "Kook" and "Showgirls" (at the Iguana Grill Mondays and Thursdays at 10pm) and was seen as Zamphuna in the PTC production of *Cute Boys in Their Underpants Fight the Evil Trolls*. Originally from New Orleans, Mr. Bradley would like to extend his thanks to Roger Cacchiotti, Sue Bowlin and the PTC Board of Directors for their kindness and support, and his sincerest gratitude to the Poet of the Theatre.

**Stuard Derrick** (Doctor's Voice/Maurice Fiddler) has appeared in numerous PTC productions. Last season he portrayed Milo in *Not Smart* and Yank in *Bound East for Cardiff*. Stuard studied acting at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and Harvard University. He has served on the PTC Board of Directors and has acted and directed with the O'Neill-by-the-Sea Festival.

Ryan Hartman-Neal (Merchant Seaman) is a seven-year Provincetown resident who has performed locally for the past three years. Earlier works included leads in *H.M.S. Although her passion is directing, she has performed in several plays and has costumed several others.   - (b) All programs must include the following statement: "Produced by special arrangement with Dramatists Play Service, Inc."
- (3) Performances must take place on the dates stated above, in the location designated and limited to 11 performance(s). Any proposed changes must be approved in writing by Dramatists Play Service, Inc.
