#### CAST

Kevin Shenk (Miss Lettice Douffet). Kevin is a past president of the PTC Board of Directors. Over the past twelve years, Kevin has appeared on Cape in PTC, W.H.A.T., Harwich, and Chatham Drama Guild productions. PTC performances include Noises Off; Larry, Queen of Scots; La Ronde; A Thurber Carnival; Night of the Iguana; and Fifth of July. Favorite PTC directors Kevin has worked with include Michael Prevulsky and Max Reagan. For her role in the Chatham Drama Guild production of Noises Off, Kevin received an A.C.T.E. award for Best Actress on the Cape. After taking three years off from doing theater, she is drawn back to the stage, her first love. Like Lettice, she knows that it is in her blood and abhors the mundane in life.

Phoebe Otis (Miss Charlotte Schoen). Phoebe has been a member of PTC since 1970 and is a former member of the PTC Board of Directors. A professional singer and performer, she has appeared in soaps and commercials in New York City, as well as nightclubs and cabarets in Provincetown. PTC productions include roles in *Dracula* (which she co-wrote), *The Revolt of Mamie Stover, Burn This*, and *The Lost Gospels of Blankenberg*. She has directed many shows for PTC, including the award-winning *Elegies for Angels, Punks and Raging Queens* and several versions of *A Christmas Carol*. She was recently seen in PTC's production of *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. Phoebe has twice been nominated for A.C.T.E. awards.

**Betty Newman** (Miss Framer). This is Betty's fifth production for PTC. Early roles include Mrs. Morris in *The Day They Shot John Lennon*, and *Elegies*.... She has also appeared in two productions of *A Christmas Carol* for PTC.

**Bart J. Murell** (Mr. Bardolph, Surly Man) brings 22 years of experience as a dancer, teacher, and choreographer with the E.B.A. Dance Theater Company. He is a P'town year-rounder and is proud to be a part of the PTC.

**Stuard Derrick** (Member of the Public). Stuard is the director of the Provincetown Playwrights series at the Provincetown Library and is a former member of the PTC Board of Directors. As an actor, Stuard has appeared in numerous PTC productions over the past seven years.

**Roger Cacchiotti** (Member of the Public). Roger is the Artistic Managing Director of the Provincetown Theater Company. Last summer Roger directed the PTC production of *Cute Boys in Their Underpants Fight the Evil Trolls*. He teaches English at the Provincetown Alternative High School.

Anthony Jackman (Director) has been a member of PTC since 1984. As an actor he has appeared in PTC productions of What the Butler Saw; Noises Off, Larry, Queen Of Scots; Jenny St. Joan; and most recently as Ben in Harold Pinter's The Dumb Waiter. His set designs have been nominated for 8 A.C.T.E. awards, and he was part of the PTC team that was presented with the George McConville Memorial Award for the acclaimed production of Elegies for Angels, Punks and Raging Queens. This summer Tony designed the set for the PTC production of Cute Boys.... He has also directed two plays for PTC: Alan Bown's Beirut and James Goldman's The Lion in Winter.
